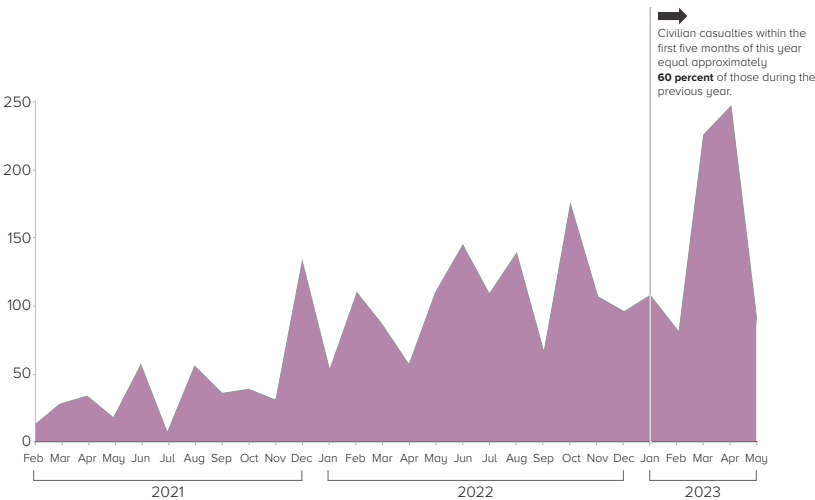


A record number of 748 civilians killed in five months
(February 1, 2021 - May 31, 2023)

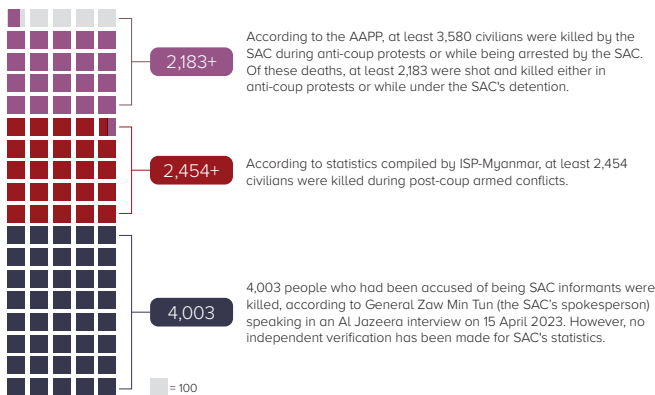
At least 748 civilians were killed in armed conflicts in Myanmar in the first five months of 2023. This marks the highest increase in civilian deaths in over two years since the 2021 coup, accounting for approximately 60 percent of the total civilian casualties in 2022. A total of 8,640 civilians have been killed since the coup.

Over 8,600 civilian deaths since the 2021 coup
(February 1, 2021 - May 31, 2023)

At least 8,640 civilians have been killed since the coup. Of that total, at least 2,183 were shot and killed either in protests or while under SAC's detention. At least 2,454 civilians were killed in armed conflicts. According to the SAC, 4,003 people were murdered after being accused of being informants despite a lack of independent verification of the SAC's statistics. According to a research paper published by Peace Research Institute Oslo (PRIO) on June 12, 2023, at least 6,337 civilians were killed in the aftermath of the coup as of September 30, 2022.
